D. <u>Budget Transfer</u>

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education approve a transfer of \$82,056 from A1620 490 00 8600 to A2630 490 08 0000 to conform with the BOCES assigned billing code for the BoTie project.

J. <u>Graduation Venue License</u>

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education approve a venue license agreement with Live Nation Worldwide, Inc. for the use of the NYCB Theatre at Westbury on June 29, 2014 at a cost not to exceed \$20,480 and authorize the Superintendent of Schools to sign this agreement. (See attached)

K. <u>Waiver of Bond</u>

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education approve the Bellmore Lions and Kiwanis Clubs' use of the Jerusalem Avenue school for their annual Strawberry Festival from 5/28/14 through 6/2/14 and agree to have the \$500 required bond waived inasmuch as Blue Sky Shows (the carnival operator), Bellmore Lions and Kiwanis all have liability insurance. 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L. Food Vending Contract for School Year 2013-2014

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education approve an extension to a vending contract with Quick Snacks Vending for the 2013-2014 school year for the provision of vending services in the District via the BOCES contract. The District will receive a commission of 47.25% on total sales; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Food Services Director is the District's authorized representative as concerns this agreement. (See attached)
